Fake Book: “Folk Music From Bulgaria”

Motive for this Fake Book

When I started international folk dancing in the 19-seventies, I very soon developed a preference for Balkan dances, especially Bulgarian. I was also caught by the Balkan music, which made me start practicing the music on my accordion, which I hadn't touched for several years. Performing the music with other musicians, also for dancers, was hindered by lack of sheet music. So I started transcribing a lot of music with pencil and music paper and build a nice collection.

After many years I attended a workshop for Balkan musicians and found, that the lack of sheet music still hindered the concerted performance. At the same time I was very well aware of today's Fake Books originating from the jazz music, of the current music authoring facilities, and of the internet sharing facilities that are available these days.

So I decided to turn the interest in my old collection of hand-written Bulgarian sheet music into an initiative to compile a Fake Book “Folk Music from Bulgaria”, by collecting digital transcriptions and by publishing it via the internet for free.

Folk Music from Bulgaria

Bulgarian folk music can be recognized as traditional Balkan music from Southeastern Europe. Bulgarian folk music distinguishes from other Balkan music, which can be explained by its unique combination of rhythms, harmony and polyphony.¹

Furthermore regions within Bulgaria have their own musical characteristics:

1. Severnaško (north): Gabrovo, Lovech, Pleven, Razgrad, Rouse, Targovište
2. Dobrudža (north-east): Silistra, Dobrich, Varna
3. Trakija or Thrace, and Strandža (south-east): Yambol, Plovdiv, Sliven, Stara Zagora, Bourgas
4. Rodopes (south): Pazardjik, Smoljan, Haskovo
5. Pirin or Bulgarian Macedonia (south-west): Blagoevgrad
6. Šop or Šopluk (west): Kjustendil, Pernik, Sofia
7. (north-west): Vidin, Montana, Vratsa

Bulgarian folk music is typically performed with traditional instruments like gaida (goat-skin bagpipe), kaval (end-blown flute), gadulka (string instrument), tapan (large double-headed drum), tambura (lute) and tarabuka (finger-drum). Another dimension was added to the (city) music with modern instruments like accordion, clarinet, saxophone, drum set, electric brass and electric guitar.

Contents

This Fake Book is put together using sheet music material that was contributed by several Dutch and German devotees of Bulgarian folk music. It is not a well-considered selection, but still I

think it shows the wide variety of Bulgarian folk music. The Fake Book contains traditional music as well as 20th century compositions, all regions of traditional music are present, music is suitable for all kinds of instruments and bands.

Bulgaria uses the Cyrillic alphabet. Many of the titles in the Fake Book are represented in both Cyrillic and Latin alphabet. Romanization may not always be consistent due to different transliteration schemes. Please refer to the article “Romanization of Bulgarian” on <http://en.wikipedia.org>. I adopted the transliteration used by my contributors, which appears to be the ISO 9 transliteration in most cases.

Several languages are used in this Fake Book: English (the most common language of the internet audience), Bulgarian (where the music originates), Dutch (the country of most contributors and myself), German (the country of one contributor), and the common Italian music terminology. Notice the difference between the German and the standard chord naming style: German H, English B; German B, English Bb.

I have not attempted to harmonize languages, but in most cases I think the meaning will be clear.

Future

This is the initial version of this Fake Book. Based on your comments and other contributions I may decide to develop a new version with revisions, additions, etc. So please don't hesitate to contact me.

Some sheet music in this Fake Book contains song text, but the primary target audience for this Fake Book is musicians. If this Fake Book “Folk Music from Bulgaria” appears to be successful, then a next Fake Book “Folk Songs from Bulgaria” may be composed, targeted at singers and choirs.
