Oh, Shenandoah reveals a relationship between the spirit of adventure embodied in any move into uncharted territory and the longing for the unknown comforts of a life recently left behind. One need not preclude the other; the traveler, when speaking to the Shenandoah, personifies a life which is not a scenario of absolutes.

The music asks for a rich tonal quality of a kind which will not preclude achieving clarity of the close harmonies and imitative motifs. The solo may be either female or male or may be done soli; again, a vocal quality is desired which can suggest the reminiscence and longing that characterize the text. The richness of the folk tune seeks a tempo which is not rushed and which permits a subtle flexibility that allows for the stressing of key words. As can be seen by the part-writing, the low "D's" and "C" in the bass voice are not mandatory.
